Positive COVID-19 Case

Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to inform you that one of our students has tested positive for COVID-19 this week. As a result, we have sent a class bubble home to self-isolate for 10 days as per government guidance. Parents of students in this bubble have been notified.

We would like to reiterate that if anyone in your household has been tested for COVID-19 then your child should not come to school until that person has received a negative result- even if they feel well.

As a general reminder, your child does not require a COVID test unless they develop symptoms of the virus. We ask that you inform the academy immediately if anyone in your household develops symptoms or receives a positive test result.

We ask for your support at this time with ensuring that students are following Government guidance both in and outside of the Academy and are adhering to the lockdown rules. This means that students should not be socialising outside of their home as they are only permitted to leave the house to attend an education setting, medical appointment or for other exceptional circumstances. Additionally, we would like to remind students that they should not be mixing with students from other bubbles on their journey to and from school.

For students to be able to attend school as much as possible, it is very important that they adhere to the national guidance outside of the academy at all times. We appreciate that this is a difficult time for young people and our parent community but these measures are crucial if we are to keep our student population safe and their families safe.
